Autumn 2

R.E: We will be exploring Islam looking at the importance of the Qur'an and Night of Power.

French: We will be able to give a written response to a simple written question and read familiar words and phrases aloud with accurate pronunciation, so that others can understand, recognise whether words are singular or plural, recognise some basic adjectives and prepare and recite familiar words in relation to parts of the body and clothes.

Music: We will focus on the appreciation of Roman music focusing on Hans Zimmer the Battle of the Gladiators. We will be composing and recording a simple tune for others to play.

P.E: We will be developing our skills through movement and dance, exploring aspects of the Ancient Romans in Britain.

Science: Forces We will be able to explain why objects fall to Earth and be able to explain about the effects of air resistance, water resistance and friction and tell you how mechanisms allow a smaller force to have a greater effect.
