

### **Personal, Social and Emotional Development**

The children will be provided with experiences and support which will help them to develop a positive sense of themselves and others; respect for others; social skills; and a positive disposition to learning.

### **Communication and Language**

The children will be provided with opportunity to speak and listen in a range of different situations and for different purposes. They will be encouraged to listen and respond to stories, information books, rhymes, poems and action songs.

### **Physical Development**

The children will be encouraged and given opportunities to be active on a daily basis. They will be taught how to use a range of large and small equipment effectively. They will learn about the importance of exercise, sleep, hygiene, diet and safety for good health.

They will also take part in a P.E. lesson every Wednesday and Friday.

### **Mathematics**

Counting, ordering and recognising numbers up to 20.

Mathematical songs and rhymes.

Mathematical language such as more and less when comparing groups of objects.

Simple practical addition, subtraction and problem solving.

Naming and describing shapes by their properties.

Simple measures including length, weight, capacity and time.

## **EYFS Reception Curriculum Map 2018-2019**



### **Topics**

*Our broad topic for the first half term is: Ourselves and for the second half of the term we will learn about Heroes.*

*The children will be involved in choosing and planning their own topics as the year progresses.*

*We will keep parents updated of topics through our monthly newsletters.*

### **Literacy**

Daily phonics sessions teaching the first 42 phonemes and graphemes.

Blending letters for reading and segmenting for writing.

Writing their own name correctly.

Activities to help develop the gross and fine motor skills involved in writing.

By the summer term children will be encouraged to read and understand simple sentences and to start to write simple sentences.

### **Understanding the World**

The children will develop the knowledge, skills and understanding to help them make sense of the world. They will be encouraged to look closely at similarities, differences, patterns and change and to ask questions about the things they see.

The children will learn to recognise and use a range of technology in school including the iPads, laptops, programmable toys and the interactive whiteboard.

### **Expressive Arts and Design**

The children will explore and share their thoughts, ideas and feelings through song, music, dance, art, design, role-play and stories.

Music is taught weekly.

The children will build up a repertoire of songs and explore the different sounds of percussion instruments to play in class and assemblies.
